# Core 4 Graduation Requirements

- English 4 Units English I, II, III, and IV
- Mathematics 4 Units
   Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and 4<sup>th</sup>
   Math
- Science 4 Units
  Biology, Chemistry, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Science
- Social Studies 4 Units
   World Geography, Civics, American
   History, World History

- Physical Education 1½ Units
   Can substitute ROTC
- Health ½ Unit
- Foreign Language 2 Units
  Two years in the same language
- Art Elective 1 Unit Fine Art Survey, Art, Music, or Drama
- Electives <u>3 Units</u>

**Total: 24 Units** 

#### Basic Core vs. Core 4

- After sophomore year, students have the opportunity to change from the Core 4 curriculum to the Basic Core curriculum.
- Both curriculums earn the same standard diploma; the difference is the coursework taken.
  - -Core 4 prepares students for entry into a 4-year college or university
  - -Basic Core prepares students for community college, technical college, other training, and employment.
- Requires approval by parents, student, and school.
- Career Pathway of six courses required for Basic Core diploma; it is highly encouraged that ALL students remain on an elective pathway for this reason (see handout).

- English I, II, III, IV
- Algebra I, Geometry, Math Essentials, Financial Math
- World Geography, Civics, American History
- Physical Science, Biology, Environmental Science
- PE and Health
- Education for Careers
- IBCA
- 4 Career Electives
- 2 Related Courses

#### **EOC**

- In addition to meeting coursework requirements, students are required to pass end of course tests in core subject areas in order to graduate from high school.
  - Algebra I <u>or</u> Geometry
  - English II or English III
  - American History <u>or</u> Biology

#### **TOPS**

• Louisiana's Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) is a comprehensive program of state scholarships and one of the most innovative and progressive student assistance programs in the nation. TOPS has four award components. The minimum grade point average is a 2.5 (core) and the minimum ACT is a 17-19. There are specific courses required to be eligible for the TOPS scholarship. See Dr. Brown to determine which TOPS award your child may be eligible for.

#### **EXPLORE** Test

- The EXPLORE test is designed to help eighth and ninth graders explore a broad range of options for their future. It prepares students not only for their high school coursework but for their post—high school choices as well.
- EXPLORE can serve as an independent program or as the entry point into ACT's <u>College and Career Readiness System</u>.

#### **PLAN Test**

• The PLAN is a preliminary ACT test that is generally administered in the sophomore year. ACT, Inc. claims that it predicts success on the ACT. It is viewed as the ACT's equivalent of the PSAT.

#### **ACT**

- Register online at <u>www.actstudent.org</u>
  - make sure to use SSN
- ACT will be given to all current Juniors and many seniors on <u>March 18<sup>th</sup></u>
   -Students do not need to register for this test.
- ZHS provides free ACT Online Prep accounts at <u>www.actonlineprep.com</u>
- See Dr. Brown if you need assistance with registering for the ACT test or to obtain your act online prep account.
